City Councilman Update

This past month, we on the City Council held the ribbon cutting for Texas' newest and second-largest skatepark in the state. The skatepark at Rick Oden Park—nicknamed The Boneyard—has 46,000 square feet of skating area and separate areas for both beginners and expert skaters. The three main sections include a street/plaza area with grinding rails and curbs, a bowl/transition area with drops and ramps, and a beginner area with gentle slopes.

The new park has an area for foot trucks and vendors and has already drawn skaters from all over the country. We know this bond project has been a long time in coming and we are proud to deliver a great attraction that draws skaters from within and outside visitors to our city.



We also broke ground recently on several other Bond Projects including the Hollobaugh Recreation Center expansion on Walnut Street and Fire Station 6 which will be moving from Holford Road to the northeast corner of President George Bush Turnpike and Campbell Road. Holford Recreation Center closed September 30 to allow for the new construction of the recreation center and adjoining pool facility. We are anticipating the new facility will be open for the 2024 swim season, and you can track the progress of all our bond projects at <u>BuildGarland.com</u>.

As the holidays are quickly approaching, I hope you can come out and join us for some of the festive winter activities occurring in Garland. Our annual Christmas on the Square festivities will again move to Firewall Town Center while the Downtown Square is under construction. The tree lighting will occur at 6:30 PM, but attractions open at 5:30 PM and include live reindeer, a snow hill, Christmas carolers and pictures with Santa.

During December, the Plaza Theater will be showing several Christmas movies including "A Christmas Story," "It's a Wonderful Live," "Elf," and "The Santa Clause." The Granville Arts Center will host the Dallas Ballet Company

performances of "The Nutcracker" December 2-11 and various holiday musical performances throughout the month. Visit <u>GarlandForChristmas.com</u> for dates and more information on holiday events throughout the city.

Finally on a completely separate topic, the City Council approved a Garland Power and Light budget amendment to purchase two Dynamis DT35 Package Turbine Generators at the Olinger Power Station. These resources will provide a total of 69MW of quick-start generation that will be able to spin up to full power production within 10 minutes. Our existing gas production facilities are showing their age and are increasingly expensive to maintain. The new electric production capacity will allow GP&L to respond to market conditions quickly and help stabilize the grid during periods of peak demand. Interestingly these package turbines are manufactured in the Houston area and delivered as a complete package on a 85' trailer that can be set up and running within 10 hours after delivery. We hope that these units will help mitigate any power outages like we experienced February 2020 or during potential rolling blackouts we faced during the summer.

Crime & Safety Update

The best way to stay safe is with neighbors looking out for each other. Garland Police Department also has several good tips to keep in mind all year long:

- Lock your cars to help deter thieves who are looking for an easy target.
- Remove valuables from your car including holiday packages, shopping bags, guns, electronics, money, medicine, and jewelry.
- Report suspicious activity. If you see suspicious activity or something (or somebody) that seems out of place, call the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840 (or call 911 for emergency or crime in progress). Remember to include details that go beyond race and gender such as behavior, vehicle description, location, time of day, hair, clothing, identifying marks, etc. Share any security camera video that may be helpful with Officer Barnes at BarnesT@garlandtx.gov.
- Vacation Watch Request (free for Garland residents). If you plan to be out of town, consider having Volunteers in Policing check your home while you are gone. You can click here to complete the Vacation Watch Request form.
- **Discourage Porch Pirates** with the following:
 - Track deliveries on-line and quickly retrieve packages from your porch as soon as they are delivered.
 - Have packages delivered to your office building or remote pickup site. Amazon has several hub lockers around the city. Walgreens, FedEx and UPS also offer similar options.
 - Ask your neighbor to collect packages from your porch when you are away from home.
 - Get a video doorbell (such as Nest or Ring). They may not always stop a Porch Pirate in their tracks, but they can help police identify them later.
- Video doorbells can be added to the Garland Video Crime Watch by going to the Garland Police Website.


