Whereas, it is a common practice, did you know that commercial solicitations of homes requires a Permit, per city ordinance? See CODE below. 26.51 Permit required for commercial home solicitations.

to person shall engage in a commercial home solicitation without having a valid, current written permit issued und provisions of this article by the Chief of Police. A permit is not required for a noncommercial home solicitation.

k person desiring to make a commercial home solicitation within the City shall make written application to the Chief of P in a form provided by the Chief of Police, for a permit. The application shall include the following information:

Thank you to everyone who came out to celebrate the grand reopening of the Downtown Square October 14! It was a raging success by all accounts as an estimated 10,000 people from around the Metroplex and beyond came out to celebrate with us. If you missed it, check out the City's YouTube page at youtube.com/garlandtxgov or Facebook page at https://www.facebook.com/GarlandTXGov/ for more videos and pictures of the event.

If you have not yet been Downtown to see the results of the more than \$20 million dollars that have been invested in the Square and the surrounding streetscapes, I urge you to do so as well. Our goal was to bring life back to this important and historical area of our City, and given the response we had the opening weekend, I would say that we have succeeded. Now we wish to continue the momentum Downtown by attracting more businesses and restaurants.

During the festivities, I was able to speak with Matt Tobin, the restaurateur who is bringing a new pizza restaurant named Fortunate Son after the Creedence Clearwater Revival song to the corner of Main Street and Fifth Street. Matt currently operates Goodfriend Beer Garden & Burger House in East Dallas and wants to replicate the success and feel of that neighborhood hangout here in Garland.

Matt showed me around his space which includes a coal-fired pizza oven, inside bar area and soon-to-be outside patio under the existing oak tree. There is a lot of interior work remaining to be done, but Matt said he wants to do it right because as a new restaurant, you only get one shot to make a good impression on patrons. Matt hopes to open by the end of this year.

As the Square project has been completed, we are now turning our attention to the next phase of growth in Garland. Council has called for a new Bond Study Committee to focus specifically on Economic Development projects that would build upon the success of the 2019 Bond Program. The Committee will begin meeting after the new year, but I would like to hear from you before then.

What kind of projects should the Committee consider? If you have ever asked yourself, it would be great if Garland had "X", this is the time to speak up and let me know. Everything is on the table from new sport complexes to new concert and entertainment venues, from transportation projects to energy generation and storage projects to infrastructure projects, from commercial development incentives to residential improvement programs, and more. Let your imagination run wild as to what you think would help Garland compete with surrounding cities in the Metroplex for sales tax dollars and for job creation, growth and retention into the future.

Video Crime Watch Sign-Up

Oakridge was officially recognized by Garland Police as the first "Video Crime Watch" neighborhood in Garland a couple years ago. Thanks to those who



have already signed up with the program. Your participation helps to quickly identify and recover critical video related to criminal investigations and deter crime in our community.

How do I sign-up and what is involved?

- Please note, the system is strictly voluntary and cannot provide direct access to any surveillance system.
- Sign-up is simple. Anyone with video doorbells or any surveillance system can sign-up by completing a short survey located on the GPD website
 - (http://www.garlandpolice.com/331/Police) then scroll down to the Garland Video Crime Watch Program.

Information requested via the online form for any resident includes:

- street address
- primary contact (last, first name)
- primary phone # (best number to reach you)
- email
- video storage (cloud, local, both or unknown)

Once completed, double-check the pin map to ensure an accurate location and hit "submit".

If a crime occurs near your area, an investigator may privately email or call you using the contact information provided and ask you to review your camera footage for suspicious vehicle(s) or person(s) during a specific time.

Sidewalk Repairs-City Cost Share Program:

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk. Find out program details at:
