
Call 911 for an active crime or the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840 when you see suspicious activity. Siren alerts notifying residents of incidents in our neighborhood are available to anyone who has subscribed on our Website or by contacting us at safety@oakridgena.org.

9-1-1 should be dialed for Police, Ambulance or Fire unit. A Police emergency is any situation involving a crime in progress, or an imminent threat to life, bodily injury, or major property damage or loss (e.g. fight or assault in progress, or a home or business burglary in progress).

Report any suspicious activity to the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840:

- Focus on behavior: What was the person doing that made you suspicious.
- Details matter: Hair, clothing (head to toe), identifying marks. Race or gender alone is not enough.
- Vehicle: Make, Model, Color, Direction of travel, License Plate
- Location & Time: Address, date, time


#### Good Neighbors Reduce Crime: Will you be mine?

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
### Garland City Council, District 7

Councilman Dylan Hedrick

I hope everyone is staying warm during this cold weather we are experiencing. On City Council, things are heating up as we are moving into our Capital Improvement Project (CIP) budgeting season. The CIP budget is a plan for funding projects which have a useful life of not less than five years and exceed \$25,000 in cost. Approved projects in this year often have budget implications for future years as funding for projects such as buildings and utility improvements are often spread over multiple years. This year's proposed CIP budget is the second largest in city history at \$559.3 million dollars, slightly under last year's largest CIP budget of \$568.2 million dollars. Spending is divided among three categories – tax-supported programs (such as parks, roads, and economic development), internal service programs (information technology), and utility revenue supported programs (meaning those projects supported by utility service fees such as water, wastewater, electric, storm and sanitation services).

Under the \$245.6 million allocated for tax-supported programs, streets and transportation receive the largest share of funding with \$65.9 million, followed by parks with \$58.7 million, and then by economic development projects with \$34.0 million. You can see the percentage breakdown here:

District 7 Update continued...

On the utility revenue supported side, \$146.8 million is earmarked for electric utility projects with \$103 million and \$52 million going to wastewater and water projects, respectively.

Although costs for equipment and materials have increased significantly due to inflation over the past year, we are expecting no property tax increase due to the 2024 CIP. The total debt service tax rate will remain at 37.56 cents per property \$100 valuation. For utilities, no rate increases are proposed for water, electric or sanitation rates. Wastewater rates will increase by 2.9% to fund collection and wastewater treatment process improvements and the stormwater rate will increase by 12.8%, bringing rates in line with surrounding comparable suburbs. to fund future drainage improvements following the completion of several drainage studies currently underway
