The Board has selected GoodBee Lawns as our Landscaping and perimeter maintenance vendor. The were highly recommended by Oakridge residents, and yields an annual savings of \$1,000.

Contract provides for:

- Plant and Bed Management (removal of previous seasonal color, change the mulch, new seasonal color)
- Turf Management (fertilizer and pre-emergent herbicide)
- General Maintenance (Mow and edge turf areas. blow sidewalks, streets and beds. Bush trimming and maintenance, weed control, trash control, and irrigation checks bi-weekly.

We are also working to submit for Neighborhood Vitality Grant propose to change entrance lights to color changing lights to reflect seasonal holidays.

#### **Oakridge Safety**

Oakridge prides itself on a long history of active involvement of its members in watching out for one another. The Oakridge Neighborhood Association (ONA), through its Crime Prevention and Safety Committee, serves the ONA's mission to improve and maintain the quality of life in Oakridge.

**Active Crime**: Call 911 for Police, Ambulance or Fire unit. A Police emergency is any situation involving a crime in progress, or an imminent threat to life, bodily injury, or major property damage or loss (e.g. fight or assault in progress, or a home or business burglary in progress)

**Suspicious Activity:** Call the non-emergency number at 972-485-4840. Remember to Focus on behavior:

- What was the person doing that made you suspicious.
- Details matter:
  - Hair, clothing (head to toe), identifying marks. Race or gender alone is not enough.
  - Vehicle: Make, Model, Color, Direction of travel, License Plate
  - Location & Time: Address, date, time

#### **General Safety Reminders:**

A constant reminder... Please lock your car and remove valuables – especially your guns and keys. If possible, put your car in the garage. Almost all unauthorized use of motor vehicle and theft from vehicles were unlocked with keys inside – don't make us an easy target!

Continue to be watchful neighbors. Addition of outdoor security lights, cameras, being outdoors walking etc., all help make our community less inviting to potential criminals. It also helps to get out and meet your neighbors

#### **Garland City Council, District 7**

Councilman Dylan Hedrick

I hope you were able to join us on February 13th at the Atrium for the Mayor's annual State of the City address. The Mayor highlighted many of the 2019 Bond Projects which have been or are nearing completion including 25 new playgrounds, four splash pads, the Downtown Square, Holford Recreation & Aquatic Center, the Garland Senior Activity Center, Surf & Swim, and the North, Central and West Garland libraries. With so much activity going on it's easy to get excited about the future of Garland!

Looking towards the future, the Mayor made a big announcement that the annual Fourth of July celebration will be returning to our Downtown Square this year and be rebranded as Red, White and You. It will be the first time since 2008 that the event will be hosted at the Square and will include a light show with 1000s of synchronized drones. If you saw the drone show at the Christmas on the Square event, this one will be even bigger, longer and more impressive.

Finally, the Mayor recognized the VN United Football Club and the Vietnamese American Community of Greater Dallas (VACGD) with the Mayor's Make Your Mark Award for their valuable contributions to the City. For the past five years, VN United Football Club has held an Asian-American soccer tournament which has drawn teams from as far away as California and Canada.

The VACGD has also contributed significantly through voter registration drives, college scholarships and interest free loans. The groups host three annual events including the Lunar New Year celebration at Cali Saigon Mall, and the Asian American Heritage Festival in May, and the DFW Food & Music Festival in October. The Vietnamese Community Center on Belt Line Road now serves as a voting center. These organizations are certainly worthy honorees. The May municipal election filing deadline has passed and the incumbents from District 1 Jeff Bass and District 4 B.J. Williams will be reelected unopposed.

#### **Councilman update continued:**

The councilmember from District 2 is term limited. and two candidates - Eric Stuvvesant and Kristen Beard – will be competing for that seat. In District 5, incumbent Margaret Lucht is being challenged by Stefaney Garcia. Seventeen City Charter amendments are also up for consideration including those concerning City Council pay, length of Council appointee contracts, how vacancies are filled, and removal of Boards and Commission members from their positions. Election day is May 4, 2024.

Our free summer concert series is changing a bit this year with concerts being spread throughout the year. The first one will be at 7:00 PM, Friday, March 1, on the Downtown Square with Texas Country Legend Gary P. Nunn. Subsequent concerts will be held the first Friday of each month downtown. 

Here's some thoughts from Reader's Digest May 2019 Edition.

- Tapping on your phone or laptop right up until bedtime is a bad way to decompress. Our brains react to the blue light emitted by computers, smartphones and LED bulbs.
- Caffeine can still sneak up on you. Hot chocolate and decaf coffee can contain up to 20 milligrams---enough to bother people who are sensitive. Alcohol is a problem too.
- Want to fall asleep faster? According to a 2017 study, have some lettuce---especially romaine.
- Lettuce contains lactucarium which has sedative properties and affects the brain.
- Now a word about sleep apnea! The muscles in the back of the throat relax too much, blocking breathing. This causes drops in blood-oxygen levels---a common sleep disrupted and potentially a dangerous one. When left untreated, sleep apnea can strain the cardiovascular system and raise your chances of developing heart problems.

If you think you may be at risk, ask your doctor about taking a home sleep test. A CPAP machine which uses a hose and mask to deliver constant air pressure may be the remedy. Again, check with your doctor about any of these statements.

### **Sidewalk Repairs-City Cost Share Program:**

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk. Find out program details at:
