
The ONA General Membership Meeting will be held Thursday, September 26th at 7:00pm via Zoom.

Garland City Council, District 7

It's that time of year again when we review and debate the City of Garland's budget for FY 2024-2025. This year's proposed budget will be the largest in the City's history as it will eclipse the \$1 billion mark for the first time. The new budget expenses this year will address the City Manager's four focus areas: 1) adequate staffing for new facilities, 2) maintain compensation and merit increases for city employees to stay competitive, 3) enhance infrastructure and maintenance funding, and 4) maintain high levels of reserves to respond to unforeseen challenges.

New staff positions include one full-time library assistant at the new West Branch Library, and two full-time staff members to operate the new Holford Recreation Center. The Police Department will add a Mental Health Clinician Position, and Sanitation will add two residential sanitation drivers and two commercial sanitation drivers to meet demand for our residential routes and new commercial accounts. Information Technology will add a Senior Network Administrator and Desktop Systems Specialist to fortify City's computer network.

A 3% merit increase is proposed for general schedule employees, with market adjustments for police and fire civil service. Thanks to the good management of our City's healthcare program, no increase is proposed for employee or retiree health insurance expenses.

Street funding will increase by \$8 million to our largest ever amount of \$41.6 million annually to respond to the results of our whole-city streets and alley condition assessment. Our transportation signs and marking program will continue as we restripe our crosswalks and stop bars and continue with traffic sign replacement. I hope you have noticed the new street name signs with the firewheel logo at major intersections.

Parks will continue one of my favorite initiatives – the wildflower median planting pilot program – this year with new sites to be added to the previous locations.

Turf replacement is scheduled for many of our sports fields and additional security cameras and dog waste stations will be added to several parks as well.

The replacement of fire fighters' personal protection equipment will continue as scheduled, and the Fire Department will add a HAZMAT vehicle to their response fleet. The Police Department will add investigation extraction software as a tool to assist their investigations. Reserves in the General Fund will rise to 59 days of operation expenditures and \$1 million will be added to Sanitation fund reserves, above 45-day fund balance requirements. These reserves become very important when we are forced to respond to events out of our control such as the straight-line windstorms at the end of May. Unexpected expenses for contracting additional crews and storm cleanup response are paid out of these reserve funds. The balances in our utility funds (water, wastewater, electric) will be increased above the minimum balance to mitigate the effects of the volatile electric market and weather patterns.

Overall, the proposed tax rate will remain constant at 68.97 cents per \$100 of valuation. However, the total tax you pay may increase due to increased property values. No change is proposed to the electric utility rate. There will be slight adjustments to water, sewer, trash/recycling, and stormwater rates which will result in an increase for an average homeowner of \$4.32 a month.

Each year, we strive to provide the highest quality public services in the Metroplex while maintaining competitive rates and fees. The ONA is a 501(C)(4) Non-Profit chartered in 1992. Its powers and authority is limited to the maintenance of 9 Entries and subdivision perimeter landscaping. The ONA has no authority over and takes no position over private property matters. The Fiscal Year begins June 1 and ends May 31st of the following year. Sidewalk Repairs-City Cost Share Program

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards.
