Garland City Council, District 7

At our Work Session October 21, the City Council received an update on the recently completed pavement condition study. The study, which began in March 2024, utilized LiDAR technology to scan and assess every street and alley in the city, assigning each segment an Overall Condition Index (OCI) score. Scores range from 0, which is a completely failed street, to 100, which is a newly built street. Scores 90 to 100 are excellent, 70-89 are good, 50-69 are fair, 25-49 are poor and 0-24 are considered failed.

The results of the study revealed that the citywide composite OCI is 70, which is on the line between good and fair. Arterial roads scored the highest with an OCI of 79. Arterial roads are main thoroughfares such as Belt Line Road or Shiloh Road. Collector streets, typically larger streets in residential neighborhoods such as Diamond Oaks Drive or Ridge Oak Drive, scored a 72 and residential streets scored a 69. Industrial streets scored a 74 and alleys received the lowest score, with an OCI of 51.

The goal of the City Council is to improve the OCI score of all streets to the highest rating possible given the available funding. Given that mandate, city staff constructed a model which takes into account factors such as the pavement type, the functional classification, deferred maintenance costs and inflation among other variables. Several modeling scenarios were then presented to the Council for consideration.

The first option was a comprehensive "Fix All" scenario, estimated to cost \$327 million over five years, which would raise the citywide OCI to 90.

Other options focused on maintaining current funding levels, roughly \$40M currently, which would cause the citywide OCI to slip by one point a year and increase our annual maintenance backlog; prioritizing alley reconstruction at a cost of \$57 million over five years; and improving residential stress Staff's recommendation is to aim to raise the citywide OCI to 77 over five years by spreading investment across the five functional categories. Residential streets will receive over half of available funding with alleys receiving roughly a quarter of funding.

I would like to see the street repairs happen even faster as deferred maintenance only makes the problem worse and more expensive to fix in the long run. I know Oakridge residents have seen some smaller street reconstruction projects over the past few years but be prepared to see even more street construction in Garland's future as we work to rebuild and improve our city. Please give me your input as to whether you agree with the proposed pavement improvement plan and what streets you would like to see reconstructed. Finally, I was happy to participate in Camelot's Annual Camelot Chili Cookoff taking home the award for Best All Around Chili.

Sidewalk Repairs-City Cost Share Program

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards.
