Garland City Council, District 7

On November 16, Garland held its fifth "Build Garland Day," which was a celebration of groundbreakings and ribbon cuttings for projects starting construction or completed from the 2019 bond election. The day included four stops around town and included a wide variety of projects from the Parks, Street, and Fire Departments.

Our first stop of the day was in South Garland where we broke ground on the new Surf and Swim complex. This project is a complete teardown and rebuild of the iconic swimming facility that has served Garland swimmers for more than 45 years. The new facility will have a lazy river, large aquatic play structure, three water slides and an "Double Surf Air Wave Rider" which simulates surfing a real wave giving truth to the name "Surf and Swim." The complex is scheduled to be open for the summer 2026 swim season. Our next stop was the ribbon cutting for the new Street Department facility. This new building houses the administrative offices, inspectors, surveyors and meeting rooms for those who work keeping our streets in good order. Although it is not a public facing facility, it is certainly an appreciated upgrade by our city workers as it replaces a 45 year old facility with worn out linoleum flooring and dated wood paneling. The new facility has roll up doors from the large meeting room which open to a covered patio. The large conference room has a beautiful canvas mural with iconic depictions of Garland and the equipment that the Department uses every day.



Our third stop was the groundbreaking for the expansion to Naaman School Road. With no eastbound access road along President George Bush Turnpike (PGBT) between Brand Road and Lavon Drive (SH 78), this heavily used roadway serves as a main thoroughfare between those two points.

The new roadway will double the number of lanes in either direction and be raised out of the 100-year floodplain thus eliminating the need to use floodgates during high rainfall events. Curbs and gutters, a storm drain system, and hiking trail along the north side of the roadway will be included. The \$36.9 million project is scheduled to be completed in mid-2027.

Finally, we reached the end of our tour at the Garlands newest fire station – Fire Station 6 – north of PGBT and west of Campbell Road. This building replaces the old fire station on Holford Road with bigger apparatus bays to accommodate the larger, modern fire fighting vehicles, individual dorm rooms to prevent disease spread, separate bunker gear cleaning and storage facilities to prevent contamination, and a large kitchen, dining, and living room.



Fire Station 6 is one of three new stations planned as a result of the 2019 Bond Program. Fire Station 1 and Fire Station 7 will also be replaced and are scheduled to be completed in 2026.

It is so important to celebrate our wins as we make progress towards completing our bond projects. Our goal on council was to have most of the projects complete within seven years of passing the bonds and we are well on our way to doing so. I appreciate everyone who voted for the eight bond propositions who made these projects possible. I am already looking forward to the next round of ribbon cutting coming next work as we look to open Holford Recreation and Aquatics Facility next year. I appreciate the opportunity you have given me to serve as your council representative in District 7. Sidewalk Repairs-City Cost Share Program

Per Garland's City Ordinance, if you own property in Garland, it is your responsibility to keep sidewalks, parkways, curbs, and driveways adjacent to your property in a good and safe condition and free from any defects and hazards. A property owner who qualifies in all three categories may now bear as little as 10 percent of the cost of fixing their sidewalk.
